1810 WP Dobson Store/Masonic Lodge

Surry County 250th

Six years before the United States was established, the founding of Surry County, North Carolina, began with a bill submitted by local leaders in 1770. North Carolina's Colonial Assembly went on to approve bill several months later in the new year, thus creating Surry County in 1771.

In celebration of those two milestone events in its history, Surry County marks its 250th anniversary with a 12month Sestercentennial celebration running from spring of 2020 to spring of 2021.

- The first event is to be a 250th Anniversary Kickoff Celebration on the square of the historic county courthouse in downtown Dobson. It was originally scheduled for May 2, 2020, but has been postponed because of the coronavirus situation. We will announce a new date for the event when it becomes available.
- The last event, in **April 2021**, is the burying of a time capsule at the historic courthouse that is to be opened 100 years later in 2121.

As more events become available, they will be posted here, so please check back periodically.

An interesting tidbit: at the time of its creation, Surry County encompassed a far greater swath of land, including modern-day Forsyth, Stokes, Surry, and Yadkin counties.


We are working on a new logo and t-shirts for the ReDiscover Rockford re-branding. Hopefully will have them ready for the September 12th event.

The Rockford Preservation Society, Inc. was organized in 1972 with the purpose of stabilizing and preserving the Town of Rockford as a historic site. Rockford was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1976 and the Rockford Preservation Society, Inc. was incorporated the same year and obtained 501c(3) designation. The Articles of Incorporation direct that the Society is "to acquire, restore, reconstruct and maintain sites, places and buildings of significant historical, architectural, scenic and aesthetic value". Through the years, the RPS has been led by dedicated volunteers and supporters interested in seeing its mission completed; to restore each property the society owns and for each to be open to the public.
